4. Themenbereich:	Wales
	Geography and landscape: Snowdonia Mountains, Brecon Beacons, rugged coastline, Cardigan Bay, national parks like Pembrokeshire Coast National Park
	History and culture: medieval castles such as Caernarfon and Conwy, Celtic and Viking influences
	Language and identity: Welsh, national symbols: red dragon, daffodil, leek
	Economy and society: tourism, sheep farming, renewable energy, popular sports: rugby and football
5. Themenbereich:	Ireland vs. Northern Ireland
	Geography: Ireland: whole island minus Northern Ireland; Northern Ireland: part of the UK; major cities
	Political Status: Ireland (Republic of Ireland): independent country; Northern Ireland: part of the United Kingdom
	History: Ireland: colonization, independence 1922; Northern Ireland: The Troubles (1960s–1998), Good Friday Agreement

•	Culture and Society: Ireland: mainly Catholic, Irish language, Irish traditions; Northern Ireland: mix of Protestant and Catholic communities, British and Irish influences, ongoing cultural identity differences
6. Themenbereich: United States of America	
•	Geography: 50 states, major cities: New York, Washington D.C., Los Angeles; diverse landscapes and national parks
•	History: Independence from Britain (1776), Civil War (1861–1865), civil rights movement
•	Government: Federal republic, President, Congress, Supreme Court; Constitution and Bill of Rights
•	Culture and society: diverse population, American Dream, popular culture (Hollywood, music, sports), innovation and technology
7. Themenbereich: Canada	
•	Geography: provinces and territories; major cities: Ottawa, Toronto, Vancouver; varied landscapes: Rockies, Great Lakes, Arctic regions
•	History: indigenous people, French and British colonization, Confederation in 1867, peaceful evolution into a modern nation
•	Government: Federal parliamentary democracy and constitutional monarchy, Prime Minister, Governor General, Parliament
•	Culture and society: bilingual (English and French), multicultural society, maple leaf as national symbol, hockey, music and arts
8. Themenbereich: Australia	
•	Geography: Continent and country, major cities: Sydney, Melbourne, Canberra; landscapes: Outback, Great Barrier Reef, deserts, rainforests
•	History: indigenous Aboriginal peoples, British colonization (1788), federation in 1901, modern multicultural society
•	Government: Federal parliamentary democracy and constitutional monarchy, Prime Minister, Governor-General, Parliament
•	Culture and Society: sports: cricket, rugby; indigenous culture, popular culture: film, music, art, “mateship” and national identity
